19.4 2021/22 SPONSORSHIP ROUND 1 REPORT - APPLICATIONS OVER \$15,000

The Council is satisfied that, pursuant to Section 254J(3) of the *Local Government Regulation 2012*, the information to be received, discussed or considered in relation to this agenda item is:

(g) negotiations relating to a commercial matter involving the local government for which a public discussion would be likely to prejudice the interests of the local government.

PURPOSE

To seek endorsement of the recommendation by Council's Sponsorship Assessment Panel to approve cash funding for S22-R1-014 and decline cash funding for applications S22-R1-013, and S22-R1-016, which requested cash funding over \$15,000 in round one of the 2021/22 Sponsorship Program.

BACKGROUND

Corporate Sponsorship Guideline (Outgoing) (GTS-003-001-G) specifies that applicants who have requested more than \$15,000 will have their application decided by Council following review and recommendation by the Sponsorship Assessment Panel.

Sponsorship is a business transaction in which Council provides a financial contribution and/or value in-kind to support an event, project, service or activity in return for negotiated commercial or other benefits. Sponsorship involves an exchange that has a measurable value to each party in commercial, communication or philanthropic terms.

The Sponsorship Assessment Panel comprises representatives from Community and Economic Development (Panel Chair); Customer and Cultural Services; Communication, Engagement and Tourism; Strengthening Communities; City Operations; and Health and Environment.

The Sponsorship Assessment Panel considers the monetary value and indicative in-kind costs for each sponsorship application, and provides a final decision/recommendation for monetary value.

Applications for outgoing sponsorship are assessed against the criteria of:

- Alignment with Council's corporate vision, mission and values
- Economic benefits to Redland City
- Supports outcomes of Council as outlined in Council's Our Future Redlands A Corporate Plan to 2026 and Beyond
- Represents value for money with regard to commercial and other benefits
- Track record of applicant regarding financial administration and general management
- Level of financial and other support from other organisations
- Benefits to the local community

ISSUES

Council received and has assessed 16 applications under the 2021/22 Sponsorship Program round one, 12 of which were for an amount of \$15,000 or less and four applications requesting more than \$15,000. Of these applications, 10 were approved, one was withdrawn and five were rejected for funding by the Sponsorship Assessment Panel, which convened on 1 November 2021.

Sponsorship Panel Recommendation to approve application S22-R1-014:

Application S22-R1-014 was submitted by Robot Productions Pty Ltd for the GreazeFest 2022 festival. GreazeFest 2022 is an annual three day festival that showcases the iconic cultural and entertainment elements origination from the 1950's including music, arts and culture. GreazeFest has run for 22 years, with the last five years being held at the Cleveland Showgrounds and historically attracts around 9,000 participants from across Queensland. This event is classified as a Tier 1 event according to the Redland City Events Strategy and Action Plan 2017-2022. The funding amount requested by the applicant is

The Sponsorship Assessment Panel's recommendation is to approve a lower cash sponsorship for the GreazeFest 2022 event of \$20,000.

In making their recommendation the Panel considered:

- The sponsorship round was significantly oversubscribed with \$236,806 in sponsorship requests compared to the funding round available budget of \$69,978.30
- The applicant's previous successful application funding amounts were of a lower value
- The high calibre of the application and event
- The wide economic and community benefits delivered by the event
- The impact of COVID on the 2021 event

• In-kind support requested and potential and historical fee waivers

The Panel determined that:

- The value for money was very high
- The community and economic benefits to Redlands Coast were very high
- Previous approved funding for applicant was at a significantly lower amount
- The round was significantly over subscribed, and a lower funding amount would allow round one funds to support more events

In addition to the request for cash sponsorship, Robot Productions Pty Ltd has sought in-kind support from Council to the indicative value of \$200 for marketing and promotion of the event on Council's website. This would include a display of Council approved flyers and posters on Redland City Council's brochure stands and noticeboards.

Assessment of the request for in-kind support has been conducted by the relevant business area and an approval has been issued.

STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS

Legislative Requirements

There are no legislative implications as a result of funding or not funding the application

Risk Management

There may be a risk of negative publicity for Council if a decision is made not to fund all or part of these applications.

Operational risks are addressed through assessment of the event management plan and ensuring all necessary permits are issued prior to the event.

Financial

The 2021/22 budget for Sponsorship is \$139,956.60 and is split between the two sponsorship rounds. Available funding for round one is \$69,978.30.

Subscription to the Sponsorship Program is highly competitive. A total of \$236,806 was requested under round 1 of the 2021/22 Sponsorship Grant.

Approval of cash sponsorship for applications S22-R1-013 and S22-R1-016 and increased funding towards application S22-R1-014, either in total or in part, would require payment to be drawn from the Sponsorship Round 2 budget.

People

There will be minimal impact to staff for these events and will be specific to administration tasks and business as usual.

Environmental

There are no environmental impacts associated with this report.

Social

Application S22-R1-014 for GreazeFest 2022 is a Tier 1 significant event which can provide multiple benefits to the local community as well as increasing visitation, stimulating tourism and economic growth by showcasing the Redlands Coast.

Council supports social outcomes through other significant funding for programs and projects promoting the support of the local employment opportunities and growth, and community and social benefits.

Human Rights
